SHOWING CLASSES

QUALIFIERS

Classes 4, 5, 12, 13, 14 & 15: Working, Small, Lightweight, Middleweight, Heavyweight, and Ladies Hunters, are qualifying events for the **2011 Horse Of The Year Show (HOYS) on 4th-9th October** in Birmingham. Horses that qualify for Final will have to be registered in the 2011 Show Hunter Register and owners must be members of the Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain. The highest placed horse in each class will qualify to enter unless it has already done so, in which case the second horse will go forward. No horse lower than second place in its class will qualify.

Classes 5, 12, 13, & 14: Small Hunter, Lightweight, Middleweight and Heavyweight are qualifying events for the **2011 National Hunter Supreme Championship Show (NHSCS) on 6th & 7th September** at Addington Manor Equestrian Centre, Addington, Buckinghamshire. Horses that qualify will have to be registered in the 2011 Show Hunter Register and owners and riders must become members of Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain. The three highest placed horses in each class will qualify to enter the NHSCS. No horse lower than third in its class will qualify. (HOYS & NHSCS classes will be judged under the Rules of the Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain)

Ladies Hunters do not have to qualify for NHSCS – they may enter directly
(HOYS & NHSCS classes will be judged under the Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain Rules)

Class 2: The Retained Racehorse Challenge is a qualifier for the **2012 Royal Windsor Show.**

Class 6: The Blue Chip Flat Ridden Sport Horse is a qualifier for the **National Hunter Supreme Championship Show (NHSCS)** on 7th September, 2011.

Class 9: The Tattersalls and RoR Thoroughbred Ridden Show Horse Class is a qualifier for the **2012 Hickstead Derby Meeting.**

Rules and Conditions

1. Entries are confined to Mares, Geldings and Stallions, 4 y.o. and over
2. Novice horses are not to have won first place in a Working Hunter. Horses SJI Grade C equivalent or above are not eligible for this class
3. All entries must be over 153 cms.
4. Riders must be 16 years and over
5. Fence Heights at final – Novice approx. 90cms; Open approx. 1.10m.
6. The Judges will ride all horses in all paces on either or both reins
7. The Judges will assess conformation and movement of each horse in-hand
8. Passports to be shown to IWHA officials at final
9. Qualifying cards signed by a show official are to be returned with a qualifying fee of €10.00 within 14 days of qualification to: D. Colebrooke (tel.087-1684067), IWHA, Cloondalghan, Garrafrauns, Dunmore, Co.Galway.

Working Hunter Ring - 10 a.m. start (prompt)

General Rules for Working Hunter Classes:

A rider may ride up to two horses in the jumping phase but then select only one horse to take forward into the ride and conformation section if so required (no change of rider is allowed). A skull cap or hat and safety harness according to the current approved BSI or European Standard must be worn by ALL competitors in the jumping phase of Working Hunter Classes. Skull caps must have a navy blue or black cover. Horses may be equipped with boots of a plain colour in the jumping phase only. **No hind boots or bandages of any description are allowed in the collecting ring, warm-up or in the actual class.**

If a horse positively stops, ceases to go forward at any time during its jumping round, or turns its quarters to a fence, or has a complete turnaround, these constitute refusals. If a horse jumps the incorrect fence out of a pen or lane it will be eliminated. Horses displaying continued disobedience, or horses leaving the ring whether mounted or dismounted, will be eliminated.

Class 1 Working Show Horses.

Hacks, Cobs/Maxi and Riding Horses, mare or gelding,
4 y.o. or over, exceeding 148 cms. Jumps not to exceed 2'9" and 2'9" spread

Class 2 Retrained Racehorse Challenge – supported by RoR and SEIB (kindly sponsored by Weatherbys Ireland) Qualifier for Royal Windsor Show 2012

Mare or gelding, 4 y.o. or over, and of any height. Riders must be 15 years old or over. Horses to be ridden in any suitable bridle and should be plaited.

The first three qualify for the final at Royal Windsor Show 2012

All entries must be registered with Weatherbys in the General Stud Book and with RoR. This class is open to thoroughbreds that **HAVE RACED ONLY**.

There will be a prize for the highest placed veteran 15 years or over. Horses will **NOT** be ridden by the judge.

Competitors must wear a safety/kite hard hat with a chinstrap.

The class to be judged 40% jumping a mixture of 8 rustic/coloured fences; 20% style while jumping and performance; 20% awarded for individual show and 20% conformation and suitability to be retrained.

PHASE 1:

Jumping to be judged: 8 rustic/coloured jumps, maximum height of fences 3' (.915m)

The following points to be deducted at the end of each jumping round:

3 points to be deducted for a knockdown

4 points to be deducted for a refusal

40 marks maximum (5 for each fence)

20 extra marks style and performance while jumping

PHASE 2:

Class returns without boots and judged for an individual show/conformation. (In some classes, at the judge's discretion, horses might be asked to do a 'show' following their jumping without leaving the ring. This is often the case with a large number in the class)

Each horse to complete an individual show. Show to include the following movements:-

Trot, canter serpentine, extended canter (gallop), halt and stand, walk off on long rein

Total marks out of 20 (to include performance, amount of retraining, suitability to diversify)

Each horse to be presented in front of the judge for conformation and suitability to be retrained. TOTAL MARKS 20.

Racing injuries will be overlooked.

Class 3 Novice Working Hunter

Mare or gelding, four years old or over, not to have won a total of £200, excluding championship money (or equivalent values), in prizemoney in any SHB(GB) affiliated Working Hunter Class, or more than 25 BE points or £200 BSJA Show-jumping, at home or equivalent abroad before 1st January in the relevant year. Fences in Novice Working Hunter Classes should have a minimum height of .985m (2'9") and a maximum height of 1.00m (3'3").

Class 4 Working Hunter – HOYS Qualifier

Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over exceeding 148 cms. to be judged in accordance with the rules herein set out. Grade A Show Jumpers and Advanced Event horses are not eligible to compete in this Class. Any horse that has qualified as a Grade A Show Jumper or Advanced Event Horse as at 1st January in the current year is not eligible to compete in Working Hunter Classes.

To be judged 60% for jumping performance, 40% as for Hunter Classes. The jumping to be judged 40% for actual jumping and 20% style and presence. Ride and conformation 40%. Fences to be a minimum of 8 and a maximum of 12 in number and a maximum height of 1.14m (3ft.9ins) at the discretion of the judge. Fences should have a natural appearance and not be easily dislodged. No un-numbered obstacle can be included in the course.

The manner of going to be taken into account. No change of rider or tack will be allowed (unless a horse is ridden under side-saddle, in which case, in order to allow the judge to ride, the saddle may be changed for the riding phase only). A rider may ride up to two horses in the jumping phase but then must select only one horse to take forward into the ride and conformation section if so required (no change of rider is allowed).

Class 5 Small Hunter– HOYS & NHSCS Qualifier

Mare or gelding. Four years old or over, exceeding 148 cms. but not exceeding 158 cms.

Class 6 Blue Chip Four, Five & Six Year Old Flat Ridden Sport Horse

This class is a qualifier for the Blue Chip Flat Ridden Sport Horse Championship to be held at the National Hunter Supreme Championships at Addington Manor Equestrian Centre, Bucks, on 7th September, 2011.

Qualification will go to the two highest placed horses not already qualified.

Horses to be shown on the flat, will not be required to jump. Snaffle bridles must be worn.

N.B. The favoured discipline, e.g. Dressage, Eventing or Show-jumping for each exhibit MUST be stated on the entry form. Horses have to be registered with SHB(GB).

Horses will not be ridden by the judge but will be required to give a short individual show of walk, trot and canter of approximately 1 minute, to be awarded marks out of a possible 20 for each pace. Lengthened strides in trot and canter must be shown. Marks out of a possible 20 will also be awarded for suitability for the chosen discipline. All horses are required for a conformation assessment to be awarded marks out of a possible 50.

Class 7 Lightweight Ridden Hunter, 4 y.o. to carry up to 13 st.

Open to any mare or gelding

Class 8 Heavyweight Ridden Hunter, 4 y.o. to carry over 13 st.

Open to any mare or gelding

Class 9 The Tattersalls and RoR Thoroughbred Ridden Show Horse Class - Qualifier for Hickstead Derby Meeting 2012

Thoroughbred mare or gelding, four years old or over, any height. Riders must be 15 years or over. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, pelham or simple double bridle. Horses should be plaited. The first two go forward to the Championship at the Hickstead Derby Meeting in 2012. Qualification will go down to 4th place if the first two have already qualified. All entries MUST be registered with Weatherbys in their General Stud Book and MUST also be registered with the RoR. The class is open to thoroughbreds that have RACED. There is a prize for the highest placed veteran – 15 years or over. Horses will be ridden by the Judge.

Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap

Class 10 Ridden Hunter Mare

Open to any mare, four years old or over, exceeding 158 cms.

Class 11 Amateur Ridden Hunter, mare or gelding, four years old or over.

A person is an amateur for horse showing purposes, when showing in amateur classes, if he or she does not:

- (a) engage in, livery, buying, selling, dealing or hiring horses as a means of deriving a main source of income. Since 1st January, 2009.
- (b) accept remuneration whether it be monetary or goods, in kind for employment in connection with horses in a racing, showing or livery stable or riding school (instruction at Pony Club and Riding Club excepted). Since 1st January, 2009.
- (c) show a horse owned or sponsored by a company or commercial firm, or a horse for which his or her immediate family accepts livery or training charges from a person outside the immediate concern. Since 1st January, 2009.
- (d) show a horse, which a professional rider has qualified in the Weight or Small Ridden Hunter classes for either the Horse of The Year Show or the Royal International Horse Show during the current year, unless the horse has subsequently been re-registered under new ownership
- (e) Professional show persons must not enter the Amateur Ring whilst the classes are in progress
- (f) A professional rider must not ride or exercise an amateur's horse on the day it is competing in amateur classes
