SHOWING CLASSES

QUALIFIERS

Classes 3, 12, 13, 14 & 15: Lightweight, Middleweight, Heavyweight, Small Hunter and Working Hunter, are qualifying events for the **2009 Horse Of The Year Show (HOYS) on 7th-11th October** in Birmingham. Horses that qualify for Final will have to be registered in the 2009 Show Hunter Register and owners must be members of the Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain. The highest placed horse in each class will qualify to enter unless it has already done so, in which case the second horse will go forward. No horse lower than second place in its class will qualify.

Classes 12, 13, 14, 15 & 16: Lightweight, Middleweight, Heavyweight, Small Hunter and Ladies Hunter are qualifying events for the **2009 National Hunter Supreme Championship Show (NHSCS) on 8th & 9th September** at Addington Manor Equestrian Centre, Addington, Buckinghamshire. Horses that qualify will have to be registered in the 2009 Show Hunter Register and owners and riders must become members of Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain. The three highest placed horses in each class will qualify to enter the NHSCS. No horse lower than third in its class will qualify. (HOYS & NHSCS classes will be judged under the Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain Rules)

Class 8: The Tattersalls and RoR Thoroughbred Ridden Show Horse Class is a qualifier for the **2010 Hickstead Derby Meeting**.

Class 1: Restricted Open Working Hunter is a qualifier for the Working Hunter Derby (sponsored by Clive Richardson, Civil Engineering and Sports Ground Construction) at **Show of the North on Sunday, 23rd August, 2009**.

Class 18: The Farmers Journal Limerick Lady Championship 2009. For two-year-old non-thoroughbred fillies, suitable for producing Hunters, Show Jumpers and Eventers. Conditions:

1. Fillies must have been registered with the I.H.B. as FOALS and must be by **approved**
 - a) Thoroughbred Stallions.
 - b) Registered Irish Draught Stallions OR
 - c) Irish Sport Horse Stallions PROVIDED that such Stallions are Thoroughbred/R.I.D. Cross
2. Dams of the Fillies must also be by the Stallions as above and registered with the I.H.B.
3. All exhibitors must have their filly's passport (Green Book) on the Show Day
4. The entry fee for a qualifying class is €15. Entry fee to the final is €20.
5. Fillies entered in the qualifying class must also be entered in some other class at that Show
6. More than one filly may be selected at any qualifying show provided that the standard of entries warrants such selection
7. Should the standard of entries be deemed to be insufficient at any qualifying Show, no filly will be selected at that Show
8. Infringement of these Conditions or Championship regulations may disqualify

Each filly selected at qualifying Shows will receive a specially designed rosette and thereafter is eligible to compete in the All-Ireland Farmers Journal Limerick Lady Championship Final to be held at Limerick Show on Sunday, 23rd August 2009.

PRIZE FUND

Each non-prizewinning filly presented at the final in Limerick will receive €50

Working Hunter

General Rules for Working Hunter Classes:

A rider may ride up to two horses in the jumping phase but then select only one horse to take forward into the ride and conformation section if so required (no change of rider is allowed). A skull cap or hat and safety harness according to the current approved BSI or European Standard must be worn by ALL competitors in the jumping phase of Working Hunter Classes. Skull caps must have a navy blue or black cover. Horses may be equipped with boots of a plain colour in the jumping phase only. Rigid or weighted hind boots are not allowed. On completion of the jumping phase all clear rounds and any other horses the judges may require should be asked to return to the ring.

Class 1 Restricted Open Working Hunter:

Mare or gelding, four years old or over not to have won a total of £400 (or equivalent values) in prizemoney in any Working Hunter class, or more than 45 BE points of £400 BSJA Show-Jumping, at home or equivalent abroad before 1st January in the relevant year. Maximum height of fences 3'6" (1.07m).

Class 2 Working Cob

Mare or gelding, four years old or over. Fences not to exceed 2'6".

Class 3 Working Hunter – HOYS Qualifier

Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over exceeding 148 cms. to be judged in accordance with the rules herein set out. Grade A Show Jumpers and Advanced Event horses are not eligible to compete in this Class. Any horse that has qualified as a Grade A Show Jumper or Advanced Event Horse as at 1st January in the current year is not eligible to compete in Working Hunter Classes. To be judged 60% for jumping performance, 40% as for Hunter Classes. The jumping to be judged 40% for actual jumping and 20% style and presence. Ride and conformation 40%. Fences to be a minimum of 8 and a maximum of 12 in number and a maximum height of 1.14m (3ft.9ins) at the discretion of the judge. Fences should have a natural appearance and not be easily dislodged. No un-numbered obstacle can be included in the course. The manner of going to be taken into account. No change of rider or tack will be allowed (unless a horse is ridden under side-saddle, in which case, in order to allow the judge to ride, the saddle may be changed for the riding phase only). A rider may ride up to two horses in the jumping phase but then must select only one horse to take forward into the

ride and conformation section if so required (no change of rider is allowed).

If a horse positively stops, ceases to go forward at any time during its jumping round, or turns its quarters to a fence, or has a complete turnaround, these constitute refusals. If a horse jumps the incorrect fence out of a pen or lane it will be eliminated. Horses displaying continued disobedience, or horses leaving the ring whether mounted or dismounted will be eliminated.

Class 8 The Tattersalls and RoR Thoroughbred Ridden Show Horse Class *Qualifier for Hickstead Derby Meeting 2010*

Thoroughbred mare or gelding, four years old or over, any height. Riders must be 15 years or over. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, pelham or simple double bridle. Horses should be plaited. **The first two go forward to the Championship at the Hickstead Derby Meeting in 2010.** Qualification will go down to 4th place if the first two have already qualified. All entries **MUST** be registered with Weatherbys in their General Stud Book and **MUST** also be registered with the RoR. The class is open to thoroughbreds that have RACED. There is a prize for the highest placed veteran – 15 years or over. Horses to be ridden by the Judge.

Class 9 Ridden Hunter Mares

Open to any mare, four years old or over, exceeding 158 cms.

Class 10 Amateur Ridden Hunter, mare or gelding, four years old or over.

A person is an amateur for horse showing purposes, when showing in amateur classes, if he or she does not:

- (a) engage in breeding, livery, buying, selling, dealing or hiring horses as a means of deriving a main source of income. Since 1st January, **2007**.
- (b) accept remuneration whether it be monetary or goods, in kind for employment in connection with horses in a racing, showing or livery stable or riding school (instruction at Pony Club and Riding Club excepted). Since 1st January, **2007**.
- (c) show a horse owned or sponsored by a company or commercial firm, or a horse for which his or her immediate family accepts livery or training charges from a person outside the immediate concern. Since 1st January, **2007**.
- (d) show a horse, which a professional rider has qualified in the Weight or Small Ridden Hunter classes for either the Horse of the Year Show or the Royal International Horse Show during the current year, unless the horse has subsequently been re-registered under new ownership
- (e) show a horse, which is exhibited by a professional rider at the same Show with the exception of Working Hunter and Ladies classes
- (f) An amateur Working Hunter may not be ridden by a professional rider in a Working Hunter Class on the same day
- (g) Professional show persons **must not** enter the Amateur Ring whilst the classes are in progress
